## PRESCHOOL



We just finished our "beginning of the year" study. We have been learning about school, the different people who work at school, and the rules in school. We were able to see Miss Cristina, the school cook. She showed us around the kitchen and all of the things she uses to cook including the can opener, the mixer, the oven and the stove. She showed us where she stores the food in the pantry, the fridge, and the big freezer. She also gave us some ice cream! We also went to Miss Jamie in the office! They learned about what Jamie does on her computer and what kind of phone calls she receives. The students' favorite part was seeing Miss Steph on the screen while she was getting buzzed into school! The preschoolers have also had a blast getting to know their friends, playing outside, using teamwork, and being "Bucket Fillers".



#### **KINDERGARTEN**

The Kindergartners went on two field trips this fall. In September we went to Van Grouw Acres Pumpkin Patch to learn about pumpkins and to enjoy God's beautiful world. While we were there we learned how a small seed grows into a beautiful pumpkin. We also learned that pumpkins come in unique colors, shapes, sizes, and textures. Our favorite activities were walking in the pumpkin patch and seeing the inside of a pumpkin that was cut open!



In October we walked to the Inwood Fire Station to learn about fire safety. Firefighter Tyler Attema gave us a tour of the fire station and showed us the trucks and equipment that firefighters use. He also shared some important ways that we can stay safe in the event of a fire. Our final activity was taking turns spraying the fire hose!



## 3rd/4th Grade

The third and fourth grade students are off to a great start! The fourth graders are proving to be great helpers and role models! The third graders are quickly adapting to the new routines and expectations of a higher grade!

The students love having their own chromebooks! They have quickly conquered the log-in process. The chromebooks are typically used several times a week for reinforcement of concepts and to begin keyboard skills. The goal is that by the end of fourth grade,

they are proficient in knowing the basics.

The class has also paired up with the Kindergarten students to help them log-in to their chromebooks. They are proving to be kind and encouraging helpers as they get the kindergarteners ready for their technology time! It is so great to see all the smiles on their faces as they work together!

In Science we just finished a unit on Plant and Animal Adaptations. So many things that we take for granted are true wonders of God's creation. This year for Social Studies we will be studying the Regions of the United States. This is always a fun year filled with projects! In Bible we will be focusing on the Old Testament and have just started studying the Judges. A huge concept for third grade Math this year is to master the multiplication facts. We will be starting this in a few weeks! The fourth graders continue to practice these facts as well.
