3rd/4th Grade

The third graders were also excited about having a new classmate - Nyla Schaffer! We are very happy to have her in our class!

We have a lot to cover and learn this year! In Reading, Math, Spelling, and Grammar, we will expand and build on the things we learned last year. Learning multiplication is a huge priority in third grade, and expanding our writing skills is very important for both classes.


Our Bible classes this year started with characteristics of the Bible, learning about the divisions, footnotes, concordance, and using maps. Our stories will focus on the Old Testament, beginning with creation. Our Social Studies will focus on Communities, and Science will cover a variety of topics.

A highlight in our classroom so far this year was our STEM project for Science. After studying the engineering process, the students had to develop a prototype to safely drop a raw egg from a height of two meters. After careful planning and creating their project with classroom supplies, the eggs were tested. We had a pretty high success rate! (Maybe I let them use too many cotton balls.) 5th/6th GRADE

To wrap up our science engineering unit, fifth and sixth graders took part in a fun STEM project where they built boats out of tin foil. Working together to brainstorm ideas, they came up with individual designs and created their boats, then tested them by adding pennies to see how many they could hold before sinking. This hands-on activity helped students learn about how things float and the importance of weight distribution, reminding them of the intricate design of God's creations in nature. After testing their boats, they talked about what worked well and what didn't, thinking of ways to make their designs better. This process encouraged a spirit of perseverance and collaboration, echoing the biblical principle of working together as a community. It was a great way for students to experience the engineering process while having fun and growing in their faith!







7th/8th GRADE

From survival skills to high-tech skills, the 7th and 8th grade class is learning it all this year! In mid-September we headed down to Klondike and then Pahoja with Lyon County Conservationist, Emily Ostrander, to learn some survival skills! The students made shelters, fished, made fire, and cooked over their fires as well! We also learned about edible plants found in the wild here in lowa! It was a neat learning experience in a non-traditional setting that we'll be remembering for a long time!

When it comes to high-tech skills, these kids aren't messing around. They jumped right in to making radio plays! Before television, many families gathered around the radio to listen to stories told in drama form. After listening to one, the students adapted children's books to fit this medium, and then the fun began! They used special microphones and an editing program called WeVideo to create these projects! - Article 1: Opening prayer and devotions were given by Board President Brian Stearns.
- Article 2: Minutes of the June 7, 2023, Society Meeting were read for information. Motion made, supported, and carried to approve the minutes as read.
- Article 3: Count off was held with 27 members in attendance. Dustin Schouten and Gerald Zwart were appointed tellers.
- Article 4: No absentee ballots were turned in.
- Article 5: Voting was held for one school board member for a three-year term, the nominees are Brian Blankespoor and Jaron Van Beek. Retiring board member is Brian Stearns. Tyler Attema will be returning for an additional three-year term which was voted on by the board.
- Article 6: Voting was held for one new foundation board member for a three-year term, the nominees are Todd Folkerts and Glenn Vande Vegte. Retiring board member is Harold Van Voorst.
- Article 7: Principal Pete Van Velzen gave the principal's report. Pete reported that EANS funds have ended. These funds were used for janitor supplies, BenQ boards, classroom furniture and various technology. He has spent time visiting classrooms and commended the teachers on the way they handle teaching 2 classes in one room. He spoke on the ESA funds and the out of state families. He expressed his appreciation to all the staff, board members and society members.
- Article 8: Matt Vande Vegte presented the Scrip Report. Earnings for the year was \$15,520.00 which was an 8% decrease from last year. The school received \$6,000.00 for their share of the earnings. The Scrip checking account balance is \$2,902.45. A thank you was expressed to Shirley Kollis for the years of having the Scrip box at her store and also to Todd Reinke for taking the scrip box at his store.
- Article 9: The Hearts & Hands report was given by Todd Reinke. Major fundraisers for the year were cookie baking, pizza sales, fudge sales, freezer meals and bake sales. Total gross revenue for the year was \$27,663.16 and total expenses were \$23,029.32. The school board will no longer be asking Hearts & Hands to supply funds for the administration and text books for the upcoming school year. As the school year progresses, Hearts & Hands will be monitoring its funds and will be donating funds as they are available.
- Article 10: Dale Kollis gave the Foundation report. Income this year was \$25,948.50. This includes multiple people that have signed up for the lifetime membership. The checking account balance is \$10,910.22. The Foundation will pay \$21,850.00 to ICS in the upcoming year.
- Article 11: The Building Committee report was given by Tyler Attema. He reported that the renovation is completed, the roof replacement is taking place, and there will be a night held this summer for summer cleaning and maintenance.
- Article 12: Election results were shared: Jaron Van Beek was elected to the school board. Todd Folkerts was elected to the foundation board.
- Article 13: Josh Van Grouw presented the 2024-2025 proposed budget of \$595,000.00. Josh explained the changes made to the budget. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to approve the budget as presented.
- Article 14: Tyler Attema thanked Harold Van Voorst and Brian Stearn for their service on Foundation Board and School Board. He also thanked Dawn Folkerts for her many years of service at ICS and also presented her with a gift.
- Article 15: The concept minutes were read. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to approve the minutes.
- Article 16: A motion was made, seconded, and carried to adjourn.
- Article 17: Josh Van Grouw closed in prayer.
